Producing a knowledge product: your knowledge contribution



Producing a person: your abilities and qualities as a researcher



Articles = mostly knowledge product




Kappe = also a knowledge product, but a lot of process

- Your ability to reflect and analyze how you arrived at your “product”
- Ability to assess the strengths and weaknesses of your work
- Your ability to critically assess your field and your place in it
- Who are you as a researcher?











Example of visual representation of relationship between the papers where each of the papers seek to answer the same question and there is a sequential relationship between the papers.



Example of visual representation of relationship between the papers when all of the papers seek to answer the same question, but there is not sequential relationship between the papers.




Example of visual representation of relationship between the papers where there is not a one-to-one relationship between the overarching research questions and the individual papers.

Textual/logical cohesiveness




- Your ability to guide the reader through the text
- “Contribution” as the organizer
- Metatext, signposting, headings, sub-headings, tables and figures




Originality

- Being able to state your contribution to the field
- Need to understand your field and your work's place within this field




Independence

- The kappe might be the only text that you write on your own (if you are in a writing tradition where co-authoring is the norm)
- Typically little room for reflection in the articles.
- Ethics, methods, literature, theories, limitations – explain the choices you have made

1. Find out as much as you can about what's expected


Examine previous kappes in your program:

Examine at least five different recently completed kappes in your program. If possible, pick theses that are similar to your project in one way or another – i.e. in terms of methods, theoretical frameworks, types of data, and the like. Examples of questions you might want to ask (there are more!):

- Look at the tables of contents to see how the thesis is structured
 - Is there a separate literature review chapter? Or is the literature review part of the introduction? Or do most kappes have a “background” or a “previous research” chapter?
 - Is there a separate theory chapter? Does the theory chapter introduce hypotheses that are meant to be tested by the doctoral project as a whole?
 - Is the discussion included in the presentation of results? Or is it merged with the conclusion? Or is it a separate chapter?
 - Is there much variety across the dissertations or do they mostly include the same chapters?
- What kind of graphic visualizations (tables and figures) are used? Are any of them used to depict how different pieces of the thesis fit together as a whole?
- Does anything in the narrative seem to deviate from what you know about writing conventions in your field? (Room for and role of reflection, author presence/voice, etc.)


2. Start a kappe folder where you can gather notes, leftovers, bits and pieces that could potentially belong in the kappe

- Gives you a place to start (even if it is mostly random notes and leftovers).
- Helps you keep track of decisions that you made that are easy to forget later on (documents your thinking and why it might have changed).




