Once Upon a Smart Home encourages you in exploring near-future fictions and imagine your new household in worlds where smart environments have radically evolved.

TEAM UP!

You can play Once Upon a Smart Home on your own or in small groups of up to 4 people.

For a better experience, if you are six or more, we advise you to split into groups of 3 to 4 people.

We recommend playing through at least two different scenarios per session. If you are short on time, you can skip the third part of the playthrough, 'Switch'.

PRINT AND PLAY INSTRUCTIONS

The content of *Once Upon a Smart Home* is designed and optimised as a print and play version. It means you have to print the resources on your own printer, and then cut out and assemble them.

Print and assemble the documents as follows:

- The activity guide (Relink_OUASH_Guide-HE.pdf): Print double-sided on A4 paper, with one guide per group. After printing, fold the sheet in half.
- The Future Fictions (Relink_OUASH_Fictions-HE.pdf): Print double-sided on A4 paper, with one copy of a scenario for every two people in a group.
- The Points of View cards (Relink_OUASH_PoV-HE.pdf): Print on A4 paper, then cut into A6 pieces (four cards per page).

If you do not have access to a printer, we suggest you read first the activity guide (Relink_OUASH_Guide-HE.pdf) and then the fictional scenarios (Relink_OUASH_Fictions-HE.pdf) on your computer, smartphone or tablet. You can open the Point of View Cards (Relink_OUASH_PoV-HE.pdf) on a second screen.
